

#### Namaste and welcome!

2022 was another challenging year, but this year I felt even more grateful as all of our Bahinis were able to get back in school after a long break due to the pandemic. The pandemic has made us think long and hard about how to provide an even more holistic approach to our efforts - like economic, digital, and physical/mental empowerment. This year we were so delighted to be able to start implementing such programs in full force. For example, just in the last few months, we have conducted hands-on skill training program on sewing to help women in the community generate income opportunities. We also started a Digital Literacy project in one of our partner schools, Setidevi by providing laptops and also training for the teachers and staff. We also ran a training program for Trainers on self-defense, a first of its kind program in the area. Girls are harassed and even abused regularly, but through this training we are not only providing them ways to be physically strong, but also mentally as well. Lastly, another major highlight was our first-ever Science Exhibition in collaboration with the local municipality, we were able to bring thousands of students, teachers, community, and even national media to see how we are advancing education in the community. We firmly believe that this will help foster STEM programs in schools for the future.

These are just a few examples of how we are empowering girls, and I know we have a lot more to do. We have had to broaden our horizons with better management and leadership skills. Thanks to one of our Board Members, Priti Bhattarai, our women-led staff in Nepal received world-class leadership training from an expert in the subject. Speaking of board members, this year was also special because we were visited by Preeti Khanal, another US-based board member. We had been working together for a long time virtually, but seeing her in person was amazing as I felt like meeting my own sister. During her visit, she led a Didi program in one of our partner schools and the students were so captivated by her presence. I feel privileged to get a chance to play a small part in making this work possible, and on behalf of the Nepal Team as well as our Board, I want to thank everyone, especially our donors, whose support has made a very meaningful impact the lives of the girls we work with.



## 20 New Bahinis Supported in 2022







This year, we welcomed 20 new girls who will receive our holistic support all the way through and hopefully beyond high school.



In 2022, we saw the emergence of young leaders like Roshani Rumba who took it upon herself to lead local tutoring sessions to empower girls.



This year, 6 more girls graduated from high school and became eligible for college and higher education.

We created 2 new community book clubs and are expanding program within our GLOW Clubs as well



We started a self-defense class by training local trainers on techniques to help keep girls and women safe. We will expand on this program in the coming years.




Poor menstrual health kills girls and women, and is often a taboo subject, but we are breaking barriers to enable girls to advocate for their own well-being.

Health check-ups are crucial in ensuring that our Bahinis (younger sisters) are physically well, and we even provide this access to their family members as well.



We conducted as many home visits as we could, and we plan to increase the number of these visits in 2023 by improving our team's mobility.



A highlight of our Didi Program was having the Field Coordinator for READ Nepal, Ms. Bina Gole come to speak with our girls about her life and how she overcame her challenges in order to lead a successful life.



Our mentoring program takes us into communities where we engage through creative programs like street plays and involving community members through dance as well.



After what seemed like forever, GLOW Club members and the community celebrated the chance to reconnect at our Local Summit.



GLOW Club members celebrated International Literacy Day by sharing their ideas, concerns, and also their talent.



Girl Advocacy Representative (Suneri Basnet) led a conversation circle on the critical issue of climate change and how it is impacting girls in Nepal.



Through the GLOW Clubs' Girl Boss Professional program girls are learning how to start a business, run it, and be their own boss.

"I am extremely thankful to the Rukmini Foundation for providing 25 Laptops and also making available a technical expert to train our teachers for all the necessary training needed. We have been teaching computers from Grade 4, but it was done only with books and lectures. Now, with availability of computers and trained teachers, we feel the real learning has begun. We also have seen great enthusiasm among students for learning and this is quite inspiring for the whole school.

We have incorporated computer learning from Grade 4 through 8 in their class schedule. Grade 9 and 10 are encouraged to use computers during their free time. We also want to share this amazing resource available to other schools, if our schedules permit. We wish all the other schools in the community also have this kind of learning opportunities for their students.

In strong coordination with the Dakshinkali Municipality we helped to conduct a first ever community-wide Science Exhibition at Arunodaya Secondary School where more than 4 thousand people participated.



Pramila Gajmer was our very first mentor (Didi), and after 10 years of service, she is moving to the next phase of her life, so we conducted a small program to show our appreciation for her many contributions to the foundation.



Mentoring young girls to be the best versions of themselves is not easy, and our mentors also need support to be their best selves, so this training program was a great way for our mentors to be there for each other as they are for their Bahinis.



As part of our Promoting Animal Welfare (PAW) project, we conducted an awareness program during "Kukur (Dog) Tihar" festival where young people learned the importance of caring for and protecting animals like dogs and cats throughout the year and not just for 1 special day.



Through our GLOW Club program we were able to create a special project where local women not only received training on tailoring, but also used their skills to create reusable sanitary pads that can be very useful for adolescent girls.



Celebrated World Earth Day by cleaning a public park with our team and some of our girls. It is not just one day of activity, but establishing a mindset that we have to play our part to keep our community / environment clean.



To practice, maintain, and train mental resilience, the students learned yoga techniques and also conducted physical exercises.


# **2022 in Numbers**
